

Distance between primary distribution box and distribution cabinet



AI Overview

The recommended minimum distance between electrical enclosures, such as a primary distribution box and a distribution cabinet, is typically 700 mm to 1.5 meters depending on standards and access requirements.

Recommended Clearances

BS 7671 specifies that for safe operation and maintenance, a minimum gangway or working space of 700 mm should be maintained between distribution cabinets or enclosures. This ensures personnel can safely access the panels for inspection, operation, or maintenance. In some cases, especially where both sides of the access way have live parts, a wider clearance of 1.5 meters is recommended to prevent accidental contact and allow safe movement. IEC 60364 and related IEC standards emphasize that electrical panels must be readily accessible and provide adequate working space around them. This includes front clearance for opening doors and side clearance for safe access to components. For residential installations, the recommended height for distribution boards is 1 to 1.8 meters from the floor, with sufficient space around the panel for safe operation.

Working Space Requirements

- Front clearance: Minimum of 3 feet (≈ 900 mm) in front of the equipment to allow doors to open at least 90 degrees and provide safe access.
- Side clearance: Minimum of 30 inches (≈ 760 mm) from the sides of the equipment, or at least the width of the equipment itself.
