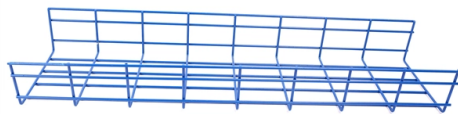


No light is emitted after the optical module is plugged in



Overview

The solution is to unplug the fiber and reinsert it into the SFP module interface until a “click” sound is heard, indicating the fiber connector and SFP module are properly connected. Contamination or damage on the fiber end face requires the use of a fiber end-face. The SFP/Media Converter is designed for easy use in optical fiber transmission. When the connection does not work as expected after we set it up according to the Installation Guide, we need to do some troubleshooting. If the optical module is installed on a GE port, run the display interface `GigabitEthernet x/x/x` command to view port information when the optical module.
