

Russian Telecom Denmark Fiber Optic Cable Project



Overview

IOEMA is a 1400 km repeatered submarine fibre optic project connecting five key northern European markets – the UK, The Netherlands, Germany, Denmark and Norway. Bornholm is close to becoming a new Nordic hub for internet traffic, after GlobalConnect has just finished connecting Sweden and Denmark with a new fibre-optic cable with a capacity of up to three petabits per second. The IOEMA cable system consists of a trunk route, connecting Dumpton Gap, UK with Kristiansand, Norway and three branches, connecting. The world's first hand-held mobile telephone was invented almost ten years before Denmark develops its first mobile phone system in 1982. Cable TV is also introduced in the 1980's. The major telecommunication companies handle the infrastructure for the development of the phone system, and in 1987. Telecommunications in Russia is highly developed and have evolved from the early days of the telegraph to modern fibre broadband and high-speed 4G networks. Due to the enormous size of the country, the country leads in the number of TV broadcast stations and repeaters. Fibia is the most significant fiber company in Denmark.
