Choose the right box based on environment (indoor/outdoor), load capacity, and durability. Check for proper IP/NEMA ratings and material quality. Site selection requirements: The distribution box should be installed in an area close to the power supply to reduce. The grounding system provides a low-impedance path for fault current and limits the voltage rise on the normally non-current-carrying metallic components of the electrical distribution system. During fault conditions, low impedance results in high fault current flow, causing overcurrent protective. - The ground leveling layer should be completed. - The foundation should be inspected and accepted as qualified, and the conduits embedded in the foundation, transformer incoming and outgoing line reserved holes, and related embedded parts should be inspected and qualified. Often, the electrical enclosure will perform as usual with incorrect grounding, though will result in a danger. The wire size for the workshop sub panel will depend on the method used for the wiring, such as using an underground conduit or overhead wiring, and if copper or aluminum wire will be used.

Each DISTRIBUTION BOX and controller must be grounded. On the US market, a 5.26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used.
