

Why are pigtails connected in two-core configurations

Common fiber pigtail types include LC, SC, ST, and FC, available. A pigtail connector is a short length of wire with a factory-terminated connector on one end and bare, exposed wires on the other. If you splice through the outlet screws and one outlet goes down, every other outlet down the chain will go down and you'll have to.
